


- MYFIRSTMILE a feeder taxi service which connected passengers to the main bus network on the Gloucester Road
- Unlike other shared taxi services, this service was designed to give better access to buses already travelling on heavily congested roads, helping more people travel in a sustainable way.


MYFIRSTMILE – The Background

- MyFirstMile was part of the Mobility on Demand Laboratory Environment (MODLE)
 and Innovate UK supported project to develop and implement new transport
 services using Bristol as a test-bed.
- Much work was done before creating the service:
 - Demand Analysis using Mobile Network Data
 - Gap Analysis
 - Design Analysis (part fixed/part flexible service)
 - Operational Simulation
 - Agent-based Simulation

MYFIRSTMILE



- Operated Monday to Friday on a scheduled service throughout the morning terminating at the Ashley Down branch of the Co-op – which became 'the hub'.
- From 3pm 8pm passengers would return to 'the hub' where the shared taxi would complete their return journey



The Technology

MYFIRSTMILE's journey planning app developed for the service

Passengers scanned QR codes on both taxis and buses used in trial area



MEMI-AAA Powered by ESCLETIX In partnership with First (**)

First mTickets used on all out bus services outside of trial area and were included in a single price

Keynsham Loop — a step in the right direction

- First bus have replaced evening bus services with a taxi services to meet a social need in a cost effective way.
- Running since September 2018 and continues to serve the needs of a limited number of passengers transferring from other bus services that only serve the terminus point at Keynsham Church.
- Existing bus tickets (and Concessionary Cards) are accepted on the taxi service.
- Likely to be replicated in other areas of operation


Keynsham Loop

What's next?

With the growing problem of congestion and air pollution to our city, we need more shared ride services to complement the existing bus network.

How can we make this work in areas like this?

- Establish if passengers are willing to take multi-leg journeys?
- Know the walking border how far is too far to walk to a bus stop?
- Encourage passengers to travel in this new way by choice, not necessity
- And get the price point and business model right

What's next and what do we need to make it work?

Local and Combined authorities are now involved in new solutions and are bidding for new funds to help shape the Public Transport of the future

- Use what we have learnt to create better integrated transport systems
- Look at all technology available to build the best platform
- Engage with local communities to design something that will be widely used
- Look for new operational partners
 - Is there a role for Community Transport?
