

REVISED WALK INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARAS 64,70,76 and 79

64. When the riverside path ends, turn left into Northleach Walk, then immediately right into Woodwell Road.

70. Walk up Sabrina Way for a few metres then turn right into Horse Shoe Drive. At the end of the drive take the path to the right. At the Portway turn left and almost immediately turn left again onto a path. In 20m, where the path forks, keep right and zig-zag down to the bottom of the slope and pass through a stile into Old Sneed Park Nature Reserve.

76. At the end of Princess Victoria Street, turn right onto Regent Street, and follow it to its intersection with Hensman's Hill where it becomes Clifton Hill. After 30m on Clifton Hill take a small path on the right which leads steeply downwards.

79. Turn right onto Hotwells Road and cross over via the traffic island to the opposite side of Hotwells Road. Go past the first right turn and take the **second** right into Rownham Mead.

TIDAL FLOODING OF AVON RIVERSIDE PATHS (BOTH BANKS) BETWEEN SEA MILLS AND AVONMOUTH

At times of extra high tides the Avon north bank riverside path between north end of Sea Mills Playing Fields/Sports Grounds and the Portway Viaduct may become flooded and not walkable. (Instructions 66,67). A section of the Avon south bank riverside path in the vicinity of Pill (exact location not yet known) is similarly affected. Rarely, at times of adverse circumstances (high winds, rainfall, exceptional tides etc) much larger stretches of the riverside paths on both banks of the Avon between Sea Mills and Avonmouth can be affected. An alternative route on the north bank is to take the path heading northeast away from the riverside path at the north end of the playing fields, which brings you to the Portway (opposite Sylvan Way) . From here, walk southeast along the Portway for about 800m, until you cross the Portway Viaduct and are able to rejoin the walk at Instruction 69.

NB a short section of the riverside path around and under Sea Mills railway bridge is usually very muddy at any time, but quite walkable with suitable footwear.
