

Easton Jamia Masjid is one of the oldest Masjid's in Bristol with a large congregation, predominantly from the South Asian diaspora



The site first appears on the 1844-1888 Ordnance Survey making this a Victorian Era structure.

It was originally built as a Boys and Girls School and remained as one for many years and then later used as a Church Hall until the purchase of it for the community in 1983.



The extension was predominently split into three main phases.

Phase 1 (Red)

Extension into the courtyard / former playground

Phase 2 (Yellow)

A range of internal upgrades to open up the interior and create a range of ancillary spaces.

Phase 3 (Green)

Enhancement to the sisters space and a considerate upgrade to the mortuary.


















































Developing this building and breathing new life over a number of generations has led to a stronger sense of community with links to all major faiths along with the High Street and wider Easton community.
